PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Examples School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Dingley Primary School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Dingley Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities
- · reduce student competition based on clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

SCOPE

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

Dingley Primary School's compulsory school uniform items are as follows:

Option 1: Navy blue shorts, navy blue tracksuit pants, or navy blue culottes, long or short sleeved polo shirt - navy with yellow striped collar with school logo, navy blue jumper with logo or bomber jacket with logo, and predominately white or black shoes with plain white socks/plain navy blue socks.

Option 2: Navy blue, yellow and white check dress, or winter tunic/winter skirt, navy blue jumper with logo or bomber jacket with logo, and predominately white or black shoes with plain white socks/plain navy blue socks or tights.

Year 6 Students

Bomber jacket with logo and Year 6 names on the back can be worn with any uniform option.

Sport Uniform (Years 3 – 6)

Wear the House Dingley Primary School logo polo shirt for timetabled Physical Education classes, Year Level Sport days and nominated sport days with navy shorts/navy culottes/navy tracksuit pants.



General appearance

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms should be clearly marked with the owner's name
- Studs, sleepers and watches are the only acceptable jewellery

Health and safety

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of lice and for student safety.

Jewellery, nails, hair accessories and similar items that interfere with students' ability to engage with school activities safely and fully are not permitted.

Students who wear braids or locs may wear them loose, except for applied technology classes where hair should be tied back for safety purposes.

School uniform hats must be worn outside from mid-August (exact date to be set by the school annually) to 30 April and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS

Uniform items can be purchased directly from Primary School Wear (PSW) Uniform Group – Cheltenham, 1 Age Street, Cheltenham VIC

The School Council has considered affordability in the development of this dress code. However, if you are facing difficulty meeting uniform costs the <u>Help with school costs and fees</u> page provides advice on support offered by the Victorian Government. If your child is starting prep or year 7 and is eligible to receive support via the <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u>, you may be eligible to access the Affordable School Uniform (ASU) program.

Please contact the principal or the DPS office to discuss support that we may be able to provide.

IMPLEMENTATION

Dingley Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website and newsletters. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, a note will be provided to the student and parents by the classroom teacher. If non-compliance with the dress code becomes a continued occurrence, the principal will be informed, and a phone call home may be required. In this event, the school will continue to work with the student and family to support compliance.



Measures taken by Dingley Primary School to address concerns about student non-compliance with the Student Dress Code will also be addressed in accordance with our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy.

EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We acknowledge that there might be instances where the enforcement of this dress code could impact students differently.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate financial hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

CONCERNS ABOUT THIS STUDENT DRESS CODE

APPENDIX A: DINGLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM ITEMS

The below uniform items and requirements are sample only:

All year round

The following items may be worn all year round, with either the summer or winter uniform:

Jumper or Vest

Navy blue polar fleece with school logo

Polo shirts

Navy blue long and short sleeved with school logo.

Skorts

Plain navy skorts without decoration or brand name and in winter can be worn with navy blue tights/stockings.

Pants

Plain, navy blue track pants without decoration or brand name

Socks or tights/stockings

Navy blue or white socks Navy blue tights/stockings

Footwear

Appropriate footwear is to be worn. Summer sandals with covered toes, black or brown school shoes or pull-on school boots or runners are permitted. No thongs, crocs or open-toed sandals are permitted.

Headwear

Navy blue, yellow or white head bands, hair ribbons, "scrunchies" or headwear worn as part of cultural/religious beliefs. Elastic Bands used to tie up hair may be worn in any colour.

Summer Uniform – to be worn in Terms 1 and 4

Dresses

Summer blue and white checked dress

Shorts

Plain navy blue shorts without decoration or brand name

Winter Uniform – to be worn in Term 2 and 3

Skivvies

Plain navy blue skivvy

Hats – to be worn from mid-August to 30 April



Navy broad brim without decoration or brand name.

Sports uniform

Navy blue polo top with navy blue shorts/skirt/skort.

There are specific uniform requirements for students participating in specialist sports such as netball, football, basketball etc. These uniforms are provided by the school for the duration of the sports season.
